For that reason, we've funded a PhD project, supervised by Smith-Nielsen, that focuses on different eating situations with caregivers and young children (0-3 years old) in relation to socialization and learning.

The quality of these early experiences determine how well you function in school, work and relationships later in life.

These social interactions are what allow children to communicate and engage long before they can form actual sentences. It's what let's them understand and navigate their world before they can find the words.

A life-changing year.

0-2 months

Shortly after coming into the world, a newborn will learn to seek contact with their parents as well as find more comfort in their parents' faces over others.

2-4 months

Babies become even more socially active. They learn to take turn doing different actions like smiling, kicking and making sounds. Actions that lay the foundation for all human communication.

4-8 months

This time is all about discovery, both verbally and physically. During this time, babies are keen to explore their surroundings, games and toys. They also start exploring different sounds, and even though they may not yet be able to say words, their language development is in full swing.

8-12 months

These months call for more social and emotional development. The parent and child relationship becomes even stronger, but it doesn't stop there. During this time, babies gain the ability to experience joint attention, meaning they can share and explore an experience together with another person. A clear sign of this is when the baby starts pointing.

The journey continues.

The pace of development and growth during the first year is the fastest, but the years that follow are also full of key milestones.

1-2 years

Thanks to secure relationships with their caregivers, babies start becoming self-aware. This self-awareness lays the groundwork for their empathy skills later in life.

2-3 years

Toddler emotions run high and their control low. They're well and truly learning by doing, which can look both impulsive and messy at times. During this time, they're also expanding their vocabulary, which grows to around 1000 words by the time they're three.

3-4 years

Caregivers will always be their number one, their safe haven to return to, but this year is all about widening social circles. It's about blossoming into a confident and social explorer that's ready to take on the world. With that social ability comes a deeper understanding of their own thoughts as well as an increase in chattiness.

4-5 years

Their social skills have been in the works for years, but it's during their fifth year that children truly learn to understand social interactions and start feeling empathy for their peers. During this time, they're also drawn to the magical, and imaginative play is in full swing. Playing with adults will help deepen connection, improve their gross motor skills as well as improve their self-esteem.


The role parents play in the early years.
